Important Dates and Times

Please ensure you can commit to the installation and breakdown dates before registering. Be sure to read the entire document for details on installation, maintenance, and breakdown.

Installation Dates: May 1 – May 9 (Special late entry available on Fridays, May 2 & May 9)

- Friday, May 9 Entry: 9:30 AM 6:00 PM | Cleanup: by 8:00 PM

B Trail Opens: Saturday, May 10, with a celebration from 10 AM – 2 PM

Trail Closes: Saturday, July 12, with a farewell celebration from 10 AM – 2 PM

Reclaim/Breakdown: Saturday, July 12; Monday, July 14 – Sunday, July 20 (Leave no trace!)

Building Your Faerie Home

Faerie homes should embody magic, romance, playfulness, and surprise! The Fae adore:

Creativity & Unique Designs using local and found materials



- ✓ Any shape or size up to 4'x4'
- ✓ Durability to withstand wind, rain, and Texas summer heat
- ✓ Respect for flora & fauna No harming plants or wildlife!
- ✓ A stable base (wood, tree cookies, etc.), well-hidden or blended into the surroundings
- Avoid: Political or offensive messages/themes
- A The Fae reserves the right to decline or remove homes that don't meet these standards

Ideal Materials for Building

台General rule of thumb: if it's biodegradable, it's ok!

- B Wood & Bark: Driftwood, cedar, redwood, thick bark, sticks, plywood
- Stone & Rock: Flat stones, pebbles, river rocks, slate, collected rocks

🖔 Moss & Natural Fibers: Dried moss, coconut husk, twine, vines

Clay & Sand-Based Materials: Air-dried clay, cob (mud & straw)

G Shells & Natural Accents: Seashells, pinecones, acorns, pressed leaves, dry grasses, nuts

 \bigcirc To increase durability: Seal wood and fibers with beeswax, linseed oil, or resin. Avoid adhesives that degrade in heat or rain.

Forbidden Materials

(These upset the Fae, who may whisk away parts of your home!)

- X Craft foam, Styrofoam
- old X Astroturf
- X Glitter
- old X Boa feathers
- X Nylon or polyester fabric





X Glass or mirrors (Consider polished stones, smooth ceramic, or other wildlife-friendly alternatives!)

X Faerie lights or electric lighting (Solar-powered only!)

X Sharp edges

X Live plants (The Fae are notoriously bad at housekeeping and forget to water them!)

To ensure the Woodland Faerie Trail remains vibrant and well-cared for, we ask that participants maintain their plots regularly. If a plot is left unattended and requires significant maintenance, it may be subject to reassignment. In such cases, previously donated plot fees are nonrefundable.
